

Quilted in a Flash



You may love to free motion quilt yourself, or it's an easy and effective option to "quilt by chequebook" and send tops to be longarmed, but what to do with charity quilts, baby quilts for your neighbours' relatives, etc. when you may not want to spend a lot of time or money to get a quilt finished.

Use the walking foot on your domestic sewing machine combined with straight or decorative stitches to create a host of easy designs that will get your "duty" quilting finished faster and easier than you ever imagined! You may find that you like the look of this quilting style so much that you use it for all your quilts.

Thread and needle choices will be discussed and there will be lots of examples to inspire you.

Requirements:

5-6 quilt sandwiches about fat quarter size (but size isn't that important, we are just stitching samples). Top fabric should show stitches well (calico is fine), backing fabric can be anything

Size 80 Topstitch needle if you have it (I will bring some)*

Polyester machine embroidery thread if you have it (I will bring some)*

40wt and 50 wt cotton threads (I will bring some)*

Pencil and paper

* If attending a live, online class I won't be able to share needles and threads with you, so just do the best you can - it's not critical
